
first priority. She joined Silverdale Picture Framing around then and again, after a time, took over that business too.

### House Insurance: Do you have enough cover?

Previously, a home could be insured based on its size i.e. replacement up to the square metre area. This meant that, if your claim was accepted by your insurance company, you would be paid the cost of repairing or replacing your home – up to the maximum square metre size you had declared on your policy.

Replacement home insurance is now based on a 'Sum Insured' basis. The Sum Insured is an amount that you specify and is the maximum amount that could be paid in respect of damage or loss to your home. This means that, if you make a claim, you will be paid the cost of repairing or replacing your home, up to the Sum Insured stated on your policy. To select a Sum Insured that is adequate for the repair or replacement of your home, you need to determine the cost of completely rebuilding your home.

So, it may cost 'X' amount of dollars to re-build your home and then 'Y' amount of dollars to clear the site, dumping and Council fees.

The total of all these costs is what you should be insuring the house for and it is strongly recommended that you seek guidance, to determine the sum insured value.

Below are some ideas...

- Seek professional advice from a builder, architect, quantity surveyor or valuer (but ensure that the valuation is for insurance purposes and does not include any market value or land value component); or
- Use the online Cordell calculator tool by visiting www.cost2build.co.nz which provides estimated building costs for homes, based on the information they provide.

# timlawrence Fishing Spot

Brrrrr! Where did that weather come from? I really thought we had another month of good fishing but this weather has really dropped the temperature and I'm sure it will drive the fish away for the winter a lot sooner than last year.

We had a few good outings over the last month or so; the first was a day trip leaving from Omaha late March. This time we took a guest angler from work and headed to Kawau Island. The bite was good until about 9 a.m. then it got tougher as the sun came up. We moved around, trying deeper water and different reefs. We landed about 20 fish, including snapper, trevally, kahawai and a good sized john dory (yum). Both Mike and I kept a couple of fish for a feed and gave the rest to our guest. The next day he didn't show for work...

I finally got hold of his wife and found that, while cleaning his fish, he slipped with the knife and cut his left forearm, resulting in five days in hospital, an appointment with a plastic surgeon to repair a damaged nerve and six weeks off work. Lesson: ALWAYS cut away from yourself...

The next trip was out to Little Barrier to chase Kingfish. We dragged a net in the Omaha Estuary to get some live baits before heading over. We are still learning how to master catching kingies and ended up getting smashed by snapper. No Kingfish on this trip but at least we had our limit of fish.


Our last trip was on Good Friday. My dad came on this trip and I really wanted to take him to the Mokohinau Islands for an evening fish. The weather was perfect; we had a good run to

Simpson's Rock and jigged for Kingfish before heading further north. The Mokohinau's were alive with schools of trevally and kahawai, with gannets diving and a whale breaching beside the boat. Dad landed a small grouper and we caught about five snapper before we decided to pull the pin and head to Little Barrier. The wind had lifted to around 10 knots so it was a long trip back in the dark. The bite was really good when we arrived and we filled the bin in about 30 minutes, with dad catching an 11-pounder before heading home, which took us until 2 a.m. – a long day.

### What is Age-Related Macular Degeneration (AMD)?

Age-related Macular Degeneration (AMD) is one of the leading causes of vision loss in individuals over 60 years old, and around 25% of people over the age of 75 are affected by this condition. It describes a deterioration of the central portion of the retina, known as the macula. The retina is the light sensitive layer in the back of the eye that reads the images that we see and therefore, when the macula is damaged, our central vision is impaired.

There are two types of AMD. The more common form is dry AMD, which is characterised by the presence of small deposits called drusen on the macula. Dry AMD usually shows a slow progression rate with less severe effects on the vision. Early symptoms can be very subtle, such as a blurring of vision and difficulty reading, but as the condition progresses this can develop into larger dark spots in the central vision. Wet AMD is less common but more severe and patients normally notice visual distortions, such as straight lines appearing wavy or crooked.

The direct cause of AMD is not known. However there are a number risk factors for developing the condition, including increasing age, high blood pressure or cholesterol, and smoking. There is also a hereditary link to this condition, so if someone in your family has it you may be at higher risk.

Currently there is no treatment for dry AMD, but progression can be slowed through healthy lifestyle choices such as good diet and, in some cases, by taking a specific mix of antioxidant vitamins. Wet AMD can be treated by a specialist with laser surgery, photo-dynamic surgery, or most commonly now through a course of intraocular injections. These treatments are not a cure for the condition, but instead are aimed

at preserving the vision that remains.


Advancements in technology, such as retinal photography, now allow us (Optometrists) to more accurately monitor any macula changes in order to detect even early, asymptom-



atic stages of degeneration. With the development of new treatments showing such promise, this early detection is very important, which is why we recommend scheduling a regular eye examination every two years.

An Amsler grid is a quick and easy way of monitoring the health of your macula. It is a simple black and white grid that you look at. Magnetised versions are available for you to pop on your fridge for convenience.

# Hydatids, Sheep Measles & Raw Feeding

There is some confusion about the legality of feeding raw meat and organs to dogs. This is largely because of a disease called Hydatids. Hydatids is a serious disease, which is spread by dogs. New Zealand suffered significant production loses in sheep in the latter half of the 19th century, due to this illness.

Dogs are the definitive host for Echinococcus Granulosus, an adult tapeworm. Livestock and humans are intermediate hosts for Hydatids, the larval form of this tapeworm.

Production loses in sheep are also caused by Sheep Measles – another disease that can be spread by dogs. Dogs are the definitive host for Taenia Ovis, the adult Sheep Measles tapeworm. Sheep and goats are intermediate hosts for Cysticercus Ovis, the larval form of the tapeworm. Unlike Hydatids, Sheep Measles does not cause illness in humans.

The Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) implemented strict control measures for farm dogs – including regular worming, and restrictions on the feeding of organ meat and tripe to dogs. The programme was a success, with New Zealand declared free from the Hydatids tapeworm in 2002. Sheep Mea-

sles is still present, but only at low levels.

The MPI created a regulation (the Biosecurity Act of 1993), to ensure that Hydatids will not be re-introduced and also to control the spread of sheep measles. Raw meat and offal can be fed to dogs if it is first frozen for a minimum ten days at -10 degrees centigrade. This will rupture any cysts present.

If you are raw-feeding your dog, check that the product you are buying meets MPI regulations.

## The Stimulation of early communication

Last time, we looked at how speech develops up to the point when you hear those very special first words. So, how can you provide the best model of speech for your young child? Many parents feel that they do not want to talk "baby" to their young children. While it's good not to use babyish words, it is important to stimulate your child at his or her level of understanding and expression, so that they hear a good model of speech and are learning. How do you stimulate your child at just the right level?

#### Follow your child's lead:

Allow your child to initiate communication. This helps you know two important things:

Their level of communication and what is of interest to them. When you respond to their communications they are more likely to learn. Wait, look and listen to what interests them. Then give the child a chance to communicate. For example, waiting to see if your child requests help opening something, or if the doorbell rings, allow them an opportunity to comment or react.



#### Be at the same physical level:

Get onto the floor with your child, allowing them to see your face, putting you in a better position to follow your child's lead.

#### **Know what to expect:**

Your child may communicate in various ways such as pointing, nodding and signs. One word may mean many different things; "bottle" may refer to anything they like to drink, or that they are thirsty. Your child may also use simplifications of words e.g. nana for banana.

#### Imitate or model the child's intended message as if you were speaking for your child.

Baby says 'a-a' while trying to reach his water. Then you say "water". If the child is able to say words, you can speak to the child using a short two word sentence like "drink water", "yummy water" or "more water?" This way you are speaking at the level at which your child is able to learn and imitate you as well.

### What's so amazing about nuts?-Part 1

Nuts are an incredible, nutrient-dense food. They are full of good fats, vitamin E and a substance called arginine. Once arginine enters your body, it is converted to nitric oxide which relaxes the walls of your arteries (making them more flexible). Arginine also helps prevent the formation of plaques. This is pretty significant, because plaque formation on the walls of the arteries causes a narrower gap for blood to pass through. Any clots that may form could cause a blockage, which will result in a heart attack. The risk of heart disease is lower in countries where nuts are eaten as part of the everyday diet. There is evidence that nut consumption also lowers the risk of type-2 diabetes in women and the risk of prostate cancer in men.

Nuts are also a great source of:

Omega 3 oils – fantastic for heart and brain health. Walnuts are especially high in omega 3. Nuts don't contain any dietary cholesterol, are very low in saturated fats and are one of the best plant-based sources of omega 3.

**Protein** – especially good for vegetarians.

**Vitamin E** – an anti-oxidant that mops up the free radicals that form in our bodies and prevents our cells from damage. It also prevents plaques from forming on the walls of the arteries and so protects your heart. Almonds and walnuts are especially good sources of vitamin E. Thirty grams of almonds provides all the daily requirements of vitamin E for adult females and almost all for adult males.

**Fibre** – is known to help lower cholesterol levels in your body. Peanuts (a legume, not really a nut), almonds and hazelnuts contain more fibre than other nuts.

**Plant sterols** – prevents the body from absorbing cholesterol and so can help lower cholesterol levels.

**Folate** – for overall healthy functioning of all cells in the body and prevention of neural tube defects (Spina Bifida) in foetuses of pregnant women.

**Selenium** – important for a healthy immune system and healthy thyroid function. New Zealand soils are low in selenium. Just one or two Brazil nuts a day will provide all the selenium you need. It's important not to eat more than this on an everyday basis as selenium can be toxic in large doses.

There is so much great information about nuts that I will continue with this topic next month...

March is traditionally the busiest month of the year for real estate transactions and this certainly held true this year, with the overall Auckland market showing a 20% increase in transactions over March last year and a 13% increase in median sales price. These movements are reflected in Millwater, with the median house price remaining over \$900,000 for the third consecutive month, on the back of strong transaction numbers. This upswing has continued in April, with solid demand being felt across the price range and some resultant increases in price becoming evident. You will probably have seen the increasing number of "Sold" stickers going up and a reducing supply of available properties for sale. Interestingly, the average days-to-sell for March was still stubbornly high at 86 days.

What remains highly evident in Millwater is the lengthened decision-making process that buyers undergo before finally making a purchase decision. The apparent variety of options means that many buyers new to the Millwater market spend many weeks coming to grips with their own "wish list". It is not unusual for us to see the same buyers still looking many months after them viewing what was by their own admission their perfect house – and missing out because they believed they had endless choice.

The advice we give to buyers still stands: have a look around at the options but quickly establish a list of needs and wants in a house, then prioritise them. Have someone who knows you review your list, because most people slip a few wants into the need list. In most cases there will be 4-6 essentials and a lot of desirables.

# coastguardcalling...

Coastguard Hibiscus had a very busy Easter, with our boats on the water over the whole holiday period. We were called to a variety of incidents – mainly breakdowns – but you would be amazed at the number of people who run out of fuel. It should be part of any trip plan to check that you have enough fuel on board. The standard rule is that you should plan for a third of your fuel to get to your destination and a third to get back – with the final third as a reserve, just in case. It's not like you can get out

and walk to the fuel station if you run out, so it's one of the more important things to work out before you leave the dock.

Our new Sealegs vessel, Hibiscus Rescue 2, is now officially in service. Designed and built in Albany, these boats are a New Zealand success story and she certainly turns heads as she motors into the water at Stanmore Bay. This new vessel is a considerable upgrade on the old one; specifically designed for military and search and rescue work, with upgraded hydraulic systems, all-wheel drive and a much more spacious interior. We've been able to fit more equipment into her and, with new touch-screen plotters and radar, she is a very powerful and efficient rescue vessel. It means that we can be anywhere in Whangaparaoa Bay and to the North of the Peninsula in around 20 minutes.



A final thought for this month is on the Rules of the Road at sea. Again, you would be amazed at the number of people who have no idea who should give way, or what the rules are about speed. This month I saw someone completely oblivious; driving his launch at around 10 knots in a marina, with boats all around him rocking and rolling from his wake. Outside marinas, you should travel at 5 knots when within 200 metres of land or any structure and also within 50 metres of any other vessel. When we're at sea in our Coastguard boats, we never travel closer than 150 metres of other boats when we're at speed. Not only is it the law, it's also just common courtesy.

Coastguard runs a number of courses: notably Day Skipper and Boat Master. These will tell you all you need to know. So, if in doubt, why not sign up — it will make you a safer boatie!

### Black Doris Plum Cheesecake

Here's an amazingly delicious recipe, thanks to Millwater resident Jay Menzies, who says is so divine that she wanted to share it with our readers. It comes from Chelsea Winter's cookbook "At My Table", which Jay thoroughly recommends.

#### **INGREDIENTS**

375g ginger nut biscuits1 tsp vanilla essence orpaste100g butter, softened1 cup cream, whipped

250g cream cheese 2x 850g Black Doris plums, drained and

½ cup icing sugarpips removedZest of 1 lemon¼ cup water2 tbsp lemon juice3 tsp sugar3 tsp gelatine

#### **METHOD**

Crumble the biscuits into a coarse crumb, either in a food processor or by wrapping the biscuits in a clean tea towel and bashing them with a rolling pin. Mix in the softened butter until well blended.

Press in an even layer the crumb mixture into the bottom and almost all the way up the

sides of a 22cm spring-form cake tin. Cover and place in the fridge for 20 minutes. (You might have some mixture left over, depending on how big your tin is).

Beat the cream cheese, icing sugar, lemon zest, lemon juice and vanilla on high speed in an electric mixer or with a hand-held beater until thick and creamy. Fold in the whipped cream. Spread the cream cheese filling evenly over the base, and return the tin to the fridge for another 30 minutes.

Reserve 4 plums and blitz the rest in a blender or food processor until smooth. Set aside.

Heat the water, sugar and gelatine in a small pan, stirring with a fork until the sugar and gelatine are dissolved. Cool slightly, then add to the plum mixture and mix well. Pour on top of the cheesecake. Cut the reserved plums in half, place face down on top and let them sink into the mixture a bit. Cover and refrigerate for at least 2 hours.

### Carrot, Orange and Ginger Cakes with Mascarpone

Diana Lakin belongs to a fabulous Book Club of 12 friends (called "The Sisters Book Club") and they meet once a month. They take turns, with the host on the night providing refreshments of wine before the book reviews and tea/coffee and baking of some sort afterwards. At their last Book Club meeting, a member made this delicious gluten-free cake, which Diana would like to share with you. Makes 8 mini cakes or 1 large cake. Ready in 40 minutes and Gluten-free.

#### **INGREDIENTS**

2 tbsp poppy seeds 2½ cups grated carrot 1 cup crushed walnuts ½ cup melted coconut oil or butter

1 cup coconut sugar zest 2 oranges 4 free-range eggs 1 tsp ground cinnamon 2 tsp ground giner

#### **TOPPING**

1 cup mascarpone ¼ cup pumpkin seeds 2 Tbsp poppy seeds



#### **METHOD**

Preheat the oven to 160°C. Grease eight holes of a Texas muffin pan, or

one regular-sized cake tin. Add all ingredients to a large mixing bowl and mix until well-combined. Divide the mixture between the muffin holes or place all in the cake tin.

Bake for 30-35 minutes (40-45 minutes for a regular-sized cake) or until a skewer comes out clean when inserted. Leave to cool completely before carefully removing from tins.

Top each cake with some mascarpone, a few pumpkin seeds and a sprinkle of poppy seeds.

These gorgeously zesty carrot cakes have a fantastic hint of ginger and a lovely moist texture. This wholesome recipe calls for coconut sugar, which gives a nice caramel flavour. Topped with pure and plain mascarpone, they make a wonderful afternoon treat with a cup of

### Coconut and Feijoa Cake

#### **INGREDIENTS**

150g butter

1 ½ cups castor sugar

4 eggs, separated

2 cups desiccated coconut

2 cups self-raising flour

1 tsp baking powder

Pinch salt

1 cup milk

1 cup peeled and chopped feijoas

Beat butter and sugar together until creamy. Beat in egg yolks. Fold in the coconut and sifted dry ingredients with the milk and fruit. Beat the egg whites until stiff and fold into cake mixture. Turn into a well-greased and lined 23 or 25cm cake tin. Bake at 180 degrees for 1 hour or until cooked. Cool for 10 minutes before turning out.







# millwatermotors

Owning a unique, hand-built sports car must be the dream of many, but it has become an almost-complete gleaming reality for Millwater resident Paul Wright. His love of motoring gems harks back to his days in the UK when, as a single man working for Lucas Aerospace, he rebuilt an original Mini Cooper S. Paul is a mechanical engineer by profession and one who has always hankered after the idea of building a sports car from scratch. He has the keen engineer's eye for detail that is needed when it comes to assembling literally thousands of parts into a dream machine that stirs the soul.

Soon after he married, Paul and his wife Jo moved from the UK to Christchurch, where Paul took up a job offer in the paper-converting machinery business. However, feeling not guite settled, they returned to the UK after two years and remained there for the next 20, before





deciding to return permanently – and to Auckland this time. That was eleven years ago. After renting in Takapuna and Mairangi Bay, they bought their first home in Tor Bay and then moved three years ago to become one of the first Millwater families.

So - how does one start to build a car from scratch? There are three New Zealand companies that provide the necessary kit and Paul chose to go with a company called Almac, in Lower Hutt. Almac is involved in motorsport racing and their Clubsprint XL package was just what Paul wanted. The whole car can be bought in modular form – a more practical option than buying everything all at once. The donor car that Paul is using is a year 2000 Mazda MX5 with low kms. This was sourced by Almac, who also supplied the original MX5 wiring loom and computer and thereby helped keep the assembly simpler than with other options.

Paul still works full-time in the paper-converting business and has used well the limited spare time that he has had over the past 2½ years. The Clubsprint XL is slightly larger than the original Lotus 7 and has more interior space than any of the competitors. The bespoke chassis is MIG welded in a jig, complete with all the laser-cut brackets in place, ensuring accuracy. Engine, gearbox and suspension mounts are fitted, as are the steering box and seat belt mounts. The aluminium panels are laser-cut for accuracy.

To keep the wet weather out, the car can come with a hood and side windows. However, Paul is something of a sports car purist and he relishes the idea of "wind in the hair and flies in the teeth" motoring. His Clubsprint XL is no mean mover either; all the


