

Serendipity sometimes comes along and opens a door that you didn't know was there, and that's what happened when we went to meet the owner of this month's beautiful motor, which features on page 23.

Local man Kevin Brown and wife Glenda have lived here for almost 6 years and are leading lights (pun intended) of one of Millwater's amazing annual Christmas light displays. Kevin's family moved from Pukekohe to Red Beach in 1970, building their first house on the waterfront and Kevin going to school locally before starting work as an apprentice printer. He told us, "I caught the bus in to work at Chancery Street for a couple of years until I could afford a car." He was then head-hunted into another printing company, where he stayed for 2 years and became foreman with a staff of sixteen at the age of just 22 – but became bored and needed a greater challenge. "I went freelance, working for a number of printing companies,

which allowed me to live the early '80s Kiwi dream of working 3 days a week, golfing on Mondays and fishing on Fridays."

Kevin then bought a printing machine and worked from home before running his own printing business in Albany for over 21 years; then selling it and, at age 45, attempting retirement for a couple of years. "That was never going to work," he said, "so I went back to school to gain my commercial skipper's ticket and began working on the charter boats at Gulf Harbour." In 2007, he started another printing business, which he sold in 2015 and took over a print finishing business in which he already had a share and which still flourishes in Albany.

"I've had a serious passion for fishing since my early teens and my dad had a boat that he rarely took out because he was seasick," Kevin said, "so I bought my first boat in 1980, the same year we got married." This began a deepening love of boats and of fishing that remains strong to this day – from the first clinker-built boat with a wee Seagull outboard, through to a 30-foot launch that he later took to Whangarei and had another 6 feet added. Fishing trips of up to 10 days up North for marlin were common. Kevin was caught once in a cyclone when a rogue wave came over the top of the boat and did some serious damage, but nobody was injured.

Trips to Tonga brought him two Tongan national record-beating fish: a 57kg oceanic white-tip shark in 1992, on a 10lb line, in which the autopsy revealed half a baby dolphin; and a 161kg striped marlin in 1994. "After the weigh-in and photographs, the locals arrived with machetes and cut the marlin up and shared it among themselves."

It's said that a heart attack is Mother Nature's way of telling you to slow down, and one of these did that just after Christmas 2015. "I still enjoy my fishing trips nowadays, but choose the better weather," Kevin added. "We have 7 grandchildren and want to be able to enjoy the best of family life together." A member of the Ford 8 &10 Club, and Warkworth Game Fishing Club since 1987, Kevin's business sponsored the 10kg fishing contest from the mid-90s into mid-2000s. Almost as an afterthought, he added that he had been picked to play rugby for Auckland under-18 reps, has played over 150 games of rugby and also played touch rugby at Silverdale Rugby Club, where he is one of the Old Boys.

Vetspeak Safe Pain Relief for Dogs and Cats

Our pets suffer the same aches and pains as humans, but, because they can't speak, it's often difficult to determine whether they're suffering. Thanks to advances in veterinary medicine, however, there are lots of options available to vets to relieve pain.

Here we answer some of the most common questions owners ask about pain in their pets.

What are the signs that my pet is in pain?

There are a number of signs, some more obvious than others, which can indicate pain, including excessive grooming, being more vocal, antisocial or aggressive behaviour, heavy panting or altered breathing, mobility issues, signs of agitation, changes in their body and posture, changes in eating, drinking, and sleeping

What painkillers can I give my pet?

Many pet owners wrongly assume it's safe to give their pet human painkillers such as ibuprofen or paracetamol, but this is not the case. Ibuprofen, for example, is toxic to dogs while paracetamol can also be highly dangerous if the wrong dosage is given. Ibuprofen and paracetamol should never be given to cats as both of these medications are HIGHLY TOXIC in cats.

If you have animal pain killers at home from a previous condition or for a different pet, contact your vet as it may or may not be appropriate to use this.

What natural products can I give my pet?

There is a huge range of supplements available. These include essential fatty acids, chondroitin, glucosamines, and cod liver oil to name but a few. It is important that good quality products are used at the correct dose.

What is your Money Personality?



I have been watching an interesting new show, Mind Over Money with Nigel Latta, which is broadcast on TVNZ 1 at 8pm on a Monday evening. It is also available on TVNZ on Demand.

Over the series, Nigel looks into the psychology of money and determines that there are four money personalities: Freedom Seekers (someone who uses

One episode relates to couples and how having the same, or different, money personalities can affect their relationships. 

Dear Mrs Bird by A.J. Pearce



There is so much to enjoy in this original and very charming novel! Set in London during the Blitz, Emmeline Lake and her best friend Bunty are trying to remain cheerful, despite the nightly bombings and disruption of life as they once knew it. Emmy would love to be a war correspondent, so when she sees an advertisement for a job in the newspaper for a prestigious publisher of newspapers, she jumps at the chance to achieve her dream. But, in her haste to impress at the interview, she doesn't ask any questions. She doesn't realise that she is committing herself to something quite different – typing letters for Henrietta Bird, the agony aunt for a failing women's magazine, which is part of the publisher's business, but far, far removed from the prestigious London Evening Chronicle that Emmy wanted to work for.

But Emmy rolls up her sleeves and gets on with the job of typing, and she soon discovers that Mrs Bird doesn't respond to many of the letters. If there is any hint of Unpleasantness, the letters must be cut up immediately. But Emmy finds herself worrying about the women who write in with tales of grief, indecision, failed love and other real-life problems, and she decides she will take matters into her own hands and write to these individuals to help them. Meanwhile, Emmy has her own personal problems to worry about, as the bombs continue to rain down on them.

I loved Dear Mrs Bird! The characters are truly delightful, and it captures a distinct period in history with such an air of authenticity you feel you are on the bombed-out streets with Emmy, trying to keep cheerful despite the terrible events unfolding. It captures the language of the time beautifully – and I understand the author has collected magazines from this era, which

adds to the storyline in the way people think and engage with each other. I feel too often historical novels of this time have too many modern sensibilities – rather than understanding just how much people were genuinely trying to be 'chipper' to get through this time. This novel is both funny and very moving, a tale of love and friendship, loss and understanding, and ultimately a book of kindness and compassion.

We observe value difference between two colours and can be measured by either High, Medium and Low contrast through how light or dark the colours

High contrast: is when two extreme colours get combined, for example a very dark colour with a very bright colour. Usually seen as authoritative and seen most often in corporate environments.

Medium Contrast: this is a combination of light and a darker shade, but very pleasing on the eye. Authoritative but more relaxed

Low Contrast: a combination of colours that are very similar, not much colour contrast difference. Softer, more approachable and relaxed.

Here are some examples of colours and their Colour and Value intensities:

Black – Bright in colour and dark in value

Olive Green - Muted in colour and medium in value

Purple - Bright in colour and dark in value.

Red – Bright in colour and medium in value

Raspberry – Muted in colour and medium in value

Light Blue – Muted in colour and light in value

Texture and Surface of fabrics also have effects on colour.

since the sub-division was opened.



Counting Down to Insulation Deadline

We have all heard the old adage: You can lead a horse to water, but you can't make it drink! For a couple of years, columns have been written about new compliance requirements for landlords of residential rental properties.

Warm Up New Zealand: Healthy Homes

The Government has been trying for the past nine years to encourage property owners to upgrade the insulation in residential properties. Funding has been available for many years, and grants have been there for low-income

owner-occupiers and landlords with low-income tenants. However, the Warm Up New Zealand: Healthy Homes grants are limited and will finish by the end of June 2018.

Counting Down

Now we are counting down to a deadline that we have all known about for the past two years: all residential rental properties must have adequate insulation by 1 July 2019. That means it must comply with the current Building Code. Insulation that was installed several years ago may need to be upgraded to comply with these requirements, unless an owner is unable to ascertain if there is underfloor, ceiling or wall insulation as the property is an older style apartment building, or you are unable to access the ceiling, walls or floor without taking invasive

I find it hard to understand any landlord who ignores this deadline. After all, we have had plenty of notice, and the affordability excuse won't work. If a landlord thinks they may qualify for a grant, there is less than one month left to apply! For the remainder, funding is available and repayments may be made with your local authority rates, and some banks will allow insulation costs to be added to the mortgage.

Interest rates are low. Now is as good a time as any to get the job done! I recommend that landlords check the Energywise website www.energywise.govt.nz for more details.



The Wolfburn Distillery in Thurso, Caithness - which is about as far North in Scotland as you can get without paddling in the icy-cold sea was re-established in 2013 after a gap of 150-years since whisky was last produced there.

Alphabetically, Wolfburn is the last of the single malt Scotch whiskies in the Jim Murray Whisky Bible and you can find it relatively easily in New Zealand – at a price that compares extremely favourably with UK retail listings that are often higher.

The Wolfburn Aurora is matured in two different types of cask: 80% in first-fill ex-bourbon barrels and the other 20% in first-fill Oloroso sherry hogsheads. When the Master Distiller decided the maturation time was right, the contents of both casks were brought together, to create this exceptionally smooth and delightfully-balanced Highland single malt.

Nose: Sweet sherry, malt and dried fruit.

Palate: Slightly peppery to start, then soft and fruity, with excellent weight for such a young whisky. Creamy vanilla and soft fruits, with sherry notes.

Finish: Light, but with a lingering sherry spiciness. Delightful.

Conclusion: An excellent young Highland whisky at a great price; recommended.

Local car enthusiast and member of the Ford 8 & 10 Car Club. Kevin Brown is the proud owner of this highly desirable 1948 Ford Anglia. With an ongoing career in the printing business and a track record of needing new challenges, in 2006 Kevin sought out something different as a project. Trawling through Trade Me, he found his 1948 Ford Anglia in Waimate, South of Christchurch, Kevin and wife Glenda drove to Waimate, loaded the Anglia onto a trailer and were back in Auckland again - all in 33 hours over the space of a weekend!

Kevin told us, "I took six months to strip the car down, bagging and labelling every nut, bolt and washer, and there were bits of cars all over the house; under beds, in the garage and in the loft." A list of parts needed was compiled, many being sourced online from the UK. The motor was taken for overhaul at Paramount Engineering in Silverdale, owned by his brother-in-law Scott Murray.

Kevin's Ford Anglia is the deluxe model; chrome bumpers, running boards, Bakelite dash and trim - and the luxury of an interior light! These items, plus the 1172cc 10hp motor, set it apart from the later, and cheaper, Ford Popular. "When all the removable parts were off, remedial work on the wooden frame was carried out, Kevin added, "and I dispensed with the cloth roof arrangement and its complex water drainage," Kevin added, "fitting instead a specially-made metal panel."

Seven years of meticulous work has revealed the gleaming silver and black beauty we see here. Ted at Henderson Vintage Car Restoration Ltd completed all the bodywork challenges through sandblasting and painting. When the outer layer of more recent upholstery was removed and the original pattern revealed, Supertrim Upholstery in Target Road faithfully copied and lovingly refitted it. The Bakelite dash and trim were refurbished, with one broken window surround having to be imaginatively repaired, as no spare was available anywhere.

The trafficator arms now work perfectly, too, thanks to (as Kevin puts it) "a labour of love and guts." These illuminated trafficators have interior fuse bulbs, access to which proved challenging. A replacement arm online was US\$300, so Kevin repaired his broken one instead.

"At the Henry Ford Memorial Day in Hamilton in 2017, we were unexpectedly asked to display our car," Kevin said, "and we walked away with second place from all the vintage cars displayed that day. It makes you proud to know that others appreciated what you have done in restoring a rare vintage car."

We, too, were proud and privileged to have seen it.

There seems to be a large element of 'business as usual' in the last months' sales figures. At the risk of repeating myself, we are entering a period of stability in the local Millwater market. There is a trend towards a more balanced market, where we see good properties that are well marketed selling

The concerning median sales price and days to sell from last month have both reverted to more normal levels, as expected. While the numbers of properties for sale locally seem to be holding at a slightly higher level, they are also now starting to sell more regularly. Indeed, when we look at the sales volumes for the first four months of 2018, it is 50% higher than the same period of 2017.

Interestingly, the average relationship between sales price and Rateable Value (RV) seems to only be varying very slightly from zero. This is rather misleading, as the actual range of percentages for individual properties range from -10% to +17%, and indeed there are only two sales for the month that fall into a range of within 3%+/- of RV. So, while the average is coming out around zero, there is a huge range of actual results, meaning that either the sales price is too high or too low, or more likely that the Rateable Value is often incorrect. We have seen many occasions where the latter seems to be the case. So, once again, RV is a very poor indicator of value of property and should not be relied upon.

If you are making assumptions about the potential sales value of your property based on its RV or have concerns about this, please feel free to get in contact with us; we will

happily give you an idea on what your property may really be worth in the current market.

Of slight concern recently is the number of local home owners who have decided to sell their homes with agents who do not live or specialise in Millwater. We understand that this is often because of a prior relationship with an agent. The concern here is these agents come in not understanding the local market or community, but also they don't have any 'skin in the game'. All they are looking for is a sale, with only a passive interest in achieving the best price for a property. When we market a house in this area, we not only feel an obligation to obtain the best possible price, we know that our next listing is dependent on us doing a great job. When we negotiate we are considering not just safeguarding the price of your property, we are also protecting the pricing of our other vendors, your neighbours and our own property. Simply put, we have a highly-vested interest in getting the best price for you. What we are concerned about is that these non-local agents are utilising methods of sale or marketing that don't work for local conditions and that they may undersell local property, impacting on everyone in the community.

Timber Slat Decks

There are many benefits of building a new deck on your home. Whether it is a ground floor patio/deck or a secondfloor balcony, al fresco living provides an opportunity to enjoy the outdoors with family and friends. When planning your budget, ensure you allow enough for any unforeseen surprises; allow a contingency, as these projects can sometimes attract unforeseen challenges. Seek advice from your building company and ask for a quote before commencing work. Sometimes a project can work out cheaper

if you engage your builder on a "charge-up basis" so ask about this option.

Adding a deck and partitioning screens or fences can provide additional security to your property - again, this can add value to the overall property.

While construction is under way, you may find disruptions to access of the property and may experience higher levels of noise than normal. Contractors will require access to power and water and may create a short-term mess on the property. These challenges are all things to bear in mind when planning your project.

It will also pay to plan for the maintenance of the deck over time and this is another factor to consider when selecting your materials and finishes.

A typical deck project may take several weeks to complete, depending on the size and complexity of the project. Be aware that larger and more complex projects could take months. CENTRAL'S TIPSJUNE 2018



Winter has come - protect fragile young citrus, tamarillo and passionfruit by making frost shelters.

Brighten up your winter outdoors by planting rainbow stemmed chards, daphne, azaleas and hellebores and stake up broad beans.

IN THE VEGGIE PATCH

- In go the strawberry plants, asparagus crowns, shallots and garlic. Snip and plant runners off existing strawberries. Plant asparagus crowns around 50cm apart. Place garlic cloves 10cms apart and 5cm deep, in their upright position (the wide root side facing down and pointed end facing up).
- Stake or build supports around broad beans as they grow
- If frost is an issue, build frost shelters for young citrus, tamarillo plants and passionfruit vines. Frost cloth or newspaper is also a cheap and easy option on the nights where the temperature dips
- For eye-catching colour in the vegetable garden plant rainbow stemmed chard

Time to plant Strawberries








The plan was to get out on the water early and fish the



Without too much effort we landed 11 decent sized snapper in a couple of hours before heading home before curfew. Just enough for a couple of feeds each.

The boys are already getting cabin fever and we have planned a two-day trip to Great Barrier in June. Hopefully Mother Nature is good to us, the weather plays ball and we manage to get onto some nice specimens up in the shallows around the island.



Back to Basics - Underwriting



We previously discussed your duty to disclose all information relevant to the insurer's assessment of your application for insurance.

Your application will be underwritten to assess the risk you present to the insurer. Your medical history, occupation and pastimes will be reviewed. People with same or similar risk, pay same or similar premiums.lf you do not

present a 'greater' risk of claiming, you will be offered cover at standard rates.

Other possible outcomes are a loading to your premiums or an exclusion to your policy. These are determined by pre-existing health conditions, risk of developing an illness due to family medical history or lifestyle factors and any risk associated with your occupation or pastime.

A loading can be a percentage increase on the standard premium. For example, if there is cancer in your family's medical history, a loading of 50% could apply making your premium cost 50% more than the standard premium. However, paying the higher premium rate ensures you will be covered if you need it. You could manage the cost by reducing the amount of cover.

Suicide, self-harm, criminal activity and negligence are generally excluded from all policies. Pre-existing conditions can also present exclusions. If you have diabetes, your plan could exclude all diabetes-related claims.

Loadings and exclusions might be reviewable if you change to a low risk job, stop participating in high risk hobbies or make lifestyle changes like stopping smoking.

Insurers don't initiate reviews. Let me know if you need help.

Are you buying a Small Business?

Does the vendor lease the business premises? Find out how long the current lease lasts; is there an option to renew? If the lease is only short term, consider making your agreement conditional on negotiating a new lease.

Lamb shank & caramelised onion tart tarin w- potato gratin & red wine rosemary jus (serves 4)

Lamb Tart tatin

- 30mls cooking oil
- 4 lamb shanks
- 1 litre reduced beef stock
- 250mls cheap red wine
- 4 cloves of garlic (finely diced)
- 1 rosemary sprig (pick off leaves)
- 1 400mls can chopped tomatoes
- Salt, pepper and sugar
- 1 small onion (diced)
- 4 large onions (thinly sliced) + 30mls cooking oil

Rolled sheet of flaky/puff pastry (baking paper cut into 7cm squares x 4)

Method

In hot fry-pan, sear off lamb shanks in ½ oil till brown. In hot saucepan, add rest of oil, sauté garlic, onion, rosemary till brown, add the red wine, reduce by 1/2. Add stock, tomatoes, seasoning, sugar, bring to boil, place lamb shanks in. Cover with foil, place in 150c pre-heated oven for 2 ½ hours or until lamb falls from bone. Remove shanks from the liquid. Remove meat from the bone. Place the sauce on stove to reduce till sauce consistency. To caramelise onions, sauté onions in saucepan w- oil on medium heat until onions are soft & brown (around 20 minutes, you must stir every few minutes to stop them burning). Mix caramelised onions with lamb shank meat and 40mls lamb sauce. Roll lamb mixture into 4 balls, place on baking paper. Cut out round of puff pastry (enough to cover lamb), push lightly around lamb, making small upside-down pie. Place on oven tray 200c oven until pastry is golden brown. Place on plate with wedge of potato gratin & lamb sauce. Accompany with your favourite vegetables.

Israeli Couscous and Roast Vegetable Warm Salad

Ingredients

1 cup Israeli couscous Season vegetables (in photo I used 3 colours capsicum, carrot, celery, broccoli) Baby spinach Cashew

Feta cheese

- 1. Unlike couscous, where it can be prepared by soaking in hot water, Israeli Couscous needs to cook similar to pasta. Simply add Israeli couscous and some olive oil in boiling water and cook until it is softened (do not cover). Drain and put aside.
- 2. Cut vegetables into similar size, spread on an oven pan lined with baking paper, drizzle with olive oil, and grill for 10 minutes in 250c. Remove from oven and give them a stir, roast for another 5 mins. (Cooking time may vary
- 3. Mix roast vegetables, cashew, baby spinach and Israeli couscous together. I am not a "sauce" person, so I just add some dry herbs and salt to taste. Sprinkle feta cheese
- 4. However, if you are like my husband who prefers to have sauce to mix with salad, simply mix roast vegetables, Israeli couscous, a shake of Worcestershire sauce, a few drops of tabasco and a few spoonsful of tomato puree together (use those with no other added ingredient such as acid). The brand I use contain 99.5% tomato puree and 0.5% salt). Then add cashew and feta cheese, season with herbs and salt to taste.

The Dangers of Ignoring a Toothache

If your toothache is caused by an abscess, it is vital to seek emergency medical care. An untreated abscess can lead to the spread of infection to your bones, heart, and even your brain - so try and get treatment

No matter the reason, if you start to experience a toothache, we recommend you make a dental appointment as soon as possible. Early treatment will help with the pain, but, more importantly, it can help stop any damage before it becomes more serious, and potentially irreversible.

Colours



It is always interesting to see people look at things differently across different cultures. I have talked about numbers in my previous article (August 2016) and, this month, let's look at how Chinese see the colours.

RED – this is considered to be a very positive colour. It is always related to happiness, celebrations and good luck. During the period of Chinese New Year, you can see red everywhere; people writing lucky messages on red paper, hanging red lantern, giving out red packets, and using red containers to serve all sorts of New Year snacks are just a few examples.

Since red is such a lucky colour, it is commonly used in weddings, welcoming new-born, business grand opening and birthdays for the elderly. As such, these are always referred as the "RED events."

It is still a very common custom to give out red eggs (boiled eggs dyed red) when a baby is one month old. For weddings, red is also everywhere; from invitation cards to wedding dress suit, to table cloths - they are always red in colour.

Very different from the West, a traditional Chinese wedding shouldn't use any WHITE because it is used in the funeral, which is also known as the "white event." This is exactly the opposite

to the West, where black is commonly used in such cases.

Just like the house of orange in the Netherlands, YELLOW is the colour loved by the ancient emperors. In the old days, only emperors were allowed to wear yellow, also known as the yellow gown. There are quite a few tales about why yellow was so beloved by the emperors, and I personally tend to agree that yellow is the nearest possible dye colour to GOLD, symbol of power and wealth.



And here is one little tip when you purchase a gift for Chinese: Never ever buy them a GREEN hat; because when a man's wife is having an affair with someone, he is referred to as "wearing a green hat." So: it is always a big NO-NO to wear a green hat.
